# MINUTES OF THE BODENHAM FLOOD PROTECTION GROUP MEETING HELD AT THE SIWARD JAMES CENTRE, AT 7.30PM ON TUESDAY, 31<sup>st</sup> JULY 2012

ITEM	ACTION
AGENDA ITEM 1 – WELCOME BY CHAIRMAN	
1. The Chairman welcomed everyone to the July Meeting and thanked Rebecca and Tim Burnill for hosting a most excellent Flood Group Barbecue the previous Saturday. A vote of thanks to the hosts was proposed by Mr Nickols and seconded by Mr Dowler. In his absence Mr Stephens was also thanked not only for his cooking skills but also for providing the barbecue equipment. In addition, thanks were given to Mr George and Mr Nicolson for providing the tables and helping to set up and take down all the garden furniture.	
2. There were 29 members present at the Meeting and apologies were received from Mr Sebbage, Mr Stephens, Mrs Bick, Mrs Dowler, and Ms Easson.	
AGENDA ITEM 2 – MINUTES OF THE LAST MEETING	
3. Approval of the Minutes of the June Meeting was proposed by Mr Rice, seconded by Mr George and agreed.	
AGENDA ITEM 3 – MATTERS ARISING	
4. <u><b>Project Bodenham Update</b></u> . The Project is very nearly complete with just two properties waiting to be completed. The Secretary has been in contact with UK Flood Barriers Limited and asked to be given a date when the work is likely to be finished.	
5. <u>Flood Warning Telemetry System</u> .	
a. The Chairman noted that the Flood Warning Telemetry System had now operated successfully on two occasions. In particular, the second event on Wednesday 18 <sup>th</sup> July could have been serious as the Millcroft Brook rose from 0.5m in depth to 1.4m in just 45 minutes. The Chairman remarked that this showed how important it was not to let our guard slip and become complacent.	
b. Most of the e-mail addresses and mobile phone numbers given to Hydro-Logic had been successfully used for alerts on 18 <sup>th</sup> July. However, the Chairman said that now was a good time to review how the early warning system had worked. He reminded Area Representatives that the alerts were not just for their personal information; it was essential that they wasted no time in relaying the warnings to any other residents in their area who might be affected	

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by the rising water level in the brook, and especially to those residents who are on their "Emergency Help" list. He added that, if anyone who is not an Area Representative and on the early warning list held by Hydro-Logic, but felt that they should be, they should speak to the Secretary and give her their contact details. It was also important that, if an Area Representative was going to be away from home for any length of time, they should notify the Secretary of their absence.	
c. It was generally agreed that the "buddy system" needed to be better organised so that the Secretary has a list of names of those that Area Representatives have arranged to be their "buddy" to assist with putting up barriers. This is especially important if they have a large number of people on their "Emergency Help" list, or if they themselves are likely to be away from Bodenham. Mr Harris noted that it had taken an hour to put up his barriers. Mrs Gibson also said that it had taken her longer than anticipated. However, both agreed that with more practice and allowing for greater ease of access to the equipment, it should not take quite so long in future.	
d. The Chairman emphasised that all residents who have flood protection equipment should practise actually installing it and know how long it would take them to completely secure their property in an emergency. He reminded members that two of the tasks for the next few months were developing an Emergency Plan and testing it. With properties so spread out around the Village this would probably take the form of a small exercise with monitors to "test" each road in turn. It was agreed that this would be very useful. The Chairman reminded the Meeting that the list of those who had volunteered to be Area Representatives for 2012/13 was attached to the Agenda. 7. <u>Visit of the CEO Herefordshire Council</u> . The Chairman recalled that Mr Chris Bull, the CEO of Herefordshire Council, had visited the Parish on Monday, 18 <sup>th</sup> June. This had provided an opportunity to raise with Mr Bull the two issues of the culvert in Mr Pugh's field and the twin culverts at the Millcroft/Ketch Lane Junction. The Chairman said that, as yet, he had not received any feedback from Herefordshire Council, so he would invite Cllr Jeremy Millar, the Ward Councillor, to seek a response.	Chairman
