Parish Precept

The Parish Precept for the financial year 2011/2012 which is an estimate of the total expenses that will have to be met from April next year has been retained at the same level as this year i.e. £8150. This amount is included within the overall Council Tax levied by Herefordshire Council and is paid to the Parish in two six-monthly instalments. Typical expenditure covers the purchase of the SID, grass cutting near the War Memorial and near the Chapel Lane bus stop, help towards Parish Hall, churchyard and kiddies play area maintenance. We also have to meet the cost of refurbished/replacement bus shelters and the various projects that may come forward as part of the Parish (Community Led) Plan.

St Michael's Church

Dear Friends,

The year is nearing its end. The days grow darker and colder. Birds and animals look for food and shelter, a place to keep warm until the Spring. Frosty mornings give way to muddy afternoons. Light and darkness vie with each other, our few, precious hours of daylight dwindle into twilight and night. God is doing all this for you and me, but Jesus' birth is almost hidden from view, we have to seek out the stable, look hard to follow the footprints of shepherds, listen hard to hear the angels' song.

During Advent we prepare for this search by searching our own hearts and minds. We strip our churches of flowers and colour, our hymns are sombre and our Sunday readings are full of prophecies and warnings. It's not a very comfortable time!

Our preparations for Christmas are far more profound than the "shop 'til you drop" message of the High Street. Shopping has nothing to do with it at all, but prayer and silence, penitence and promise will be the way we will come to kneel before a cradle in a dusty stable. Then we will know the love of God, his mercy and grace and his deep care and compassion for each one of us, this Christmas.

May I wish you all a very peaceful Advent, a blessed Christmas and a joyous Epiphany,

BODENHAM PARISH COUNCIL continued

Road Safety - Woodhouse Lane/A417 Junction We commented on the difficulty in negotiating the junction of Woodhouse Lane and the A417 in the October Newsletter and now learn that the Herefordshire Council/Amey Highways officer has responded to a complaint from an affected resident pointing out that the new mirror had been checked again by the maintenance and traffic management teams. It was reiterated that the mirror is a standard highway mirror and positioned to give the best view wherever you pull up on the junction. It is stated that a 'plain' mirror is not permitted under the traffic regulations and the only alternative would be to remove the mirror altogether.

The Parish Council has also received complaints about poor white lining along the A417 (now rectified) and at the Ketch Lane/Millcroft Road junction and in this context would draw attention to the court judgement in a recent case brought against a highway authority which confirmed the following important points:-

- The authority's duty to 'maintain' relates to the fabric of the highway but not signs and markings
- · There is no requirement for the highway authority to give 'warning of obvious dangers' and
- Drivers are 'first and foremost responsible for their own safety'

Reference to this landmark judgement is now incorporated in the Dept. for Transport "Manual for Streets. You have been warned!!

Road Safety – Use of Speed Indicating Device (SID)

Many of you will have seen the new Parish Council-owned SID in operation on the road approaching the War Memorial and along The Moor near Eastfields/Gravel Farm. The unit will also be appearing for short periods in other parts of the village in an attempt to remind drivers of their speed and the speed limit. Data on every vehicle movement is 'captured' and downloaded to enable reference to the police for enforcement action should this become necessary. "Excessive speed" is the most frequently raised topic in parish surveys and can have a marked detrimental effect on the quality of life of residents. Your cooperation is respecting the village speed limits would be greatly appreciated. If you wish to make any comments about the use of the SID you are most welcome to come along to a Parish Council meeting or let Chris Smith the Parish Clerk know on 01568 797132.

Road Safety - Proposed Speed Limit in Bowley Lane

Following an approach by the Parish Council several years ago we have responded to recent Herefordshire Council/Amey consultation on a proposed 40mph speed limit along Bowley Lane. The current limit is the national 60mph restriction which is considered to be totally inappropriate and we have requested that the new 40mph limit should extend along Bowley Lane from Saffron's Cross to the northern Parish boundary at Butford Brook.

Herefordshire Councillor's Report

Green Bins – One Year On. Our green bin recycling has been running for one year. The service collected nearly 30,000 tons of recyclable rubbish in its first year and this was only possible with your co-operation. Well done! Not only does this contribute to saving the planet, it saves us landfill tax of £48 per ton, going up to £56 next April. That would be £1½ m this year, £1¾m next. Recycling and refuse collections this Christmas will be on the normal days. This is possible through the excellent work of our contractors and staff, helped a little this year by Christmas Day being on a Saturday.

Christmas in Hereford. Widemarsh Street will be formally re-opened at a simple ceremony on 4 December. It should be quite atmospheric with a torch light procession from The Old House through Hightown and Widemarsh Street. The works have dramatically improved the atmosphere in the street where all should now enjoy a great Christmas. Join in! Park & Rides will operate as normal on Saturdays, 9 am – 6 pm, until 18 December. There's a big seasonal programme including a skating rink. Have fun - support your City - Happy Christmas.

Fast(er) Broadband or lack of it. Some progress is now being made.

- Airband Community Internet is providing a wireless broadband service with speeds up to 16Mb in the North and East of Leominster funded by the EU. This service could be extended once the Leominster-Ludlow-Tenbury triangle is connected.
- Allpay is providing a wireless system, 2 4Mb in the Allensmore area, to be extended to a salient from Golden Valley, Madley to Wellington and Marden.
- The pilot recently announced will cover the South-East of the County predominantly, not the whole County as we all hoped.
- To have any hope of bringing something better to this area we will have to establish the need. This may have
 to be done in the near future through a very short leaflet. We will try and use the results from the recent
 Community Plan questionnaires which you were so good at filling in. However, qualifying entries may need
 post codes.
- BT's "Race to Infinity" gives people the chance to vote for their area. Only exchanges with 1,000+ subscribers
 are eligible which rules out most of Herefordshire Gotcha! However, why not think positive and enter
 anyway at fastbroadband4herefordshire.org




