Dogs

As all dog owners appreciate they are wonderful companions and can give many years of pleasure to the owner. However a minority of owners cause great offence and inconvenience when they fail to clean up after their dog. Failure to do so became an offence in law from 25thOctober when Dog Control Orders came into force throughout Herefordshire. Perhaps the most important effect of the new Orders is that you must remove your dog's faeces from all land within the county "to which the public are entitled or permitted to have access without payment".

Proposed Changes to Bodenham Public Rights-of-Way

We reported in last month's Newsletter of the Parish Council endorsement of proposed minor changes to public footpaths along The Moor. We'd like to make clear that the Bodenham Ramblers, who are not affiliated with the (national) Ramblers Association, were also consulted by the Parish Council and raised no objection to the proposed changes. St Michael's Church

Dear Friends,

The year rushes on and Autumn gives way to Winter. The birds are busy at the bird tables now that they have stripped the hedges and trees of berries. November is a month of great Festivals and Commemorations. We begin with All Saints Day and end with Advent Sunday, in between come All Souls Day, Bonfire Night, Remembrance Day, the Festival of Christ the King, and St Andrew's Day. We seem to spend the month looking back and forward at the same time! It is important to remember past events and great times in history, to commemorate all the young men and women who have fought for our freedom to live our lives in 2010. Sadly, so many people are still putting their lives on the front-line as we face threats from those who wish to do us harm. We remember the men and women of our Armed Forces who have died in recent conflicts, we remember people who have been kidnapped and murdered, innocent people who have died in bombings. There never seems an end to violence and conflict.

We sometimes call the month of November the "Kingdom Season" in church, because the theme of God's kingdom runs through all our services this month. This Kingdom has Jesus as its King. He is not a King who uses terror to subdue his subjects, he is not a King who values wealth and power above all else, he is not a King who has taken power by force. Jesus is a King who gave his life so that we might live in love and peace with each other. He journeyed through Galilee with a band of followers, he stopped to help people and to teach them the rules of his kingdom. They are very simple: "Love God and love your neighbour as yourself". When he died he asked God to forgive his persecutors, and when he rose from the dead he sought out his friends who had deserted him to reassure them that he still loved them and needed them to reveal his kingdom to the world.

This month, as we remember all the sad times of conflict in our world, let us also remember what Jesus taught us. Love and forgiveness were his lessons. We pray for peace and justice in the world, but we must never forget that God's grace and mercy can only live in the world through our actions and faith, if we want the world to change we must change ourselves and live by those Kingdom values following our King, Jesus our Saviour.





Herefordshire Councillor's Annual Report

Spending Review. At the time of writing the Government's spending review announcement is a week away. However, our finance team has been working on options. Our Government grant totals £241m and if the floated 25% cut over 4 years were applied to that it would be an eyewatering £60m. The grant is made up of various components. For example £88m is the dedicated schools' grant and £51m is housing and council tax benefit. It is unlikely the cut will be across the board. It is expected to be around £22m with the likelihood of serious money coming out of concessionary fares, local transport funding and business rates/support grant. The plan to save £8.5m + per year involves reductions in full time and agency staff, cutting spending with suppliers, reducing the number of buildings in Council ownership, redesigning tourist services, sharing many key services with the NHS and other measures. I will have more details for the Parish Council for the meeting on 1 November.

Cattle Market Redevelopment Proposals. I hope many of you were able to visit Stanhope's exhibition of their proposals for the old market site. Scaled down from earlier plans, they will bring over £80m of private sector finance into the retail development. Odeon have signed up to a 6 screen digital cinema complex including a conference centre. Negotiations continue with Debenhams, John Lewis and House of Fraser, for the 3 storey department store, and Waitrose for the small food hall. 500 new car parking spaces on 2 levels are planned. The 400-space Garrick House multi-storey will be retained. Look it up at www.herefordoldlivestockmarket.co.uk Local Cider and Perry. Raise an elbow to our local producers! This year they did well again against international competition. Butford Organics (Janet and Martin Harris from Bowley Lane), won 2nds for their sparkling Perry and still organic Cider with a "highly commended" apple juice at the Bath & West Show. Newtons Cider (Tom and Paul Stephens from Newton Lane) entered their Autumn Harvest Perry and Cider in the International Cider Challenge which included entries from France, Australia, South Africa and many others. Their Perry won silver and the Cider bronze. English producers did well to win the "Best" in both categories - Hogans Perry from Alcester and Merrydown Cider from Sussex. French Ice Cider won a couple of Golds but who drinks that? 

A local resident reports two recent scams. He's had a letter from Hong Kong telling him about a large sum of money that's just waiting for him. All he has to do – and you're probably not going to be surprised by this – is to supply all his banking details. This was not a one-off, and if you get the same incredible offer, IGNORE IT

Another venture involves having pieces of paper stuck to the back window of your car. The idea is that, normally in a car park, you'll walk to your car, get in, start the engine, and then notice something in your back window. You get out, walk to the back of the car, and then see someone else jump into the driving seat and make off with your vehicle. If you're a female driver they'll probably have gone off with your home address, house keys, credit cards and other useful items. As a precaution, if you DO see anything stuck to your rear window, wait till you get home before investigating. You know it makes sense!


