### **BODENHAM PARISH COUNCIL**

The next Parish Council meetings will be held at 7.30pm on <u>Monday 7th February</u> at the Siward James Centre. **Salt bins -** Bodenham requested five additional salt bins from Amey and two - at God Almighty Hill near Bodenham/Marden parish boundary and at Holly Bush Lane – have already been installed. The other three – at the Bodenham Lake entrance, at the bottom of Bowley Lane and in Bowley Lane between Wall House and Broadfield Lodge – have been given 'high priority' by Amey.

**Parish Walk.** In November three Coucillors Tony Clark, Tony Mitcheson and Mike Mullenger met representatives of Amey and conducted a parish walk on which 31 defects across the Parish were identified as needing attention. These concerned, for example, white lines in need of renewal, drainage problems, potholes and signage. Many of the defects have already been attended to. **Continued on Page 3....** 

St Michael's Church

Dear Friends,

In 1611, one of the English language's most important books – the King James Version of the Bible, popularly known as the Authorised Version was published. The year 2011 sees the 400th anniversary of the King James Bible. It wasn't the first English Bible by any means or even the most popular version at the time, but its style of language together with research of Bible manuscripts and their original languages (mainly Hebrew and Greek), discoveries of new documents and not least the combined effect of the Renaissance and Reformation – not just in England but across Europe, together with the dramatic development of printing, brought into being the well loved and renowned Bible version we have to this day. It is an enduring version, although it has had several revisions to update and correct errors of translation and print, it is still memorable and admired in its prose and layout.

The translation we use in our Sunday services today is the New Revised Standard Version and it takes its place in a long tradition of English translations that began well before the publication of the King James Bible. Between 1382 and 1395 John Wycliffe defied Church authorities to work with other scholars to produce an English Bible. In 1525-6 William Tyndale published his New Testament and began work on the Old Testament. In 1535 the Coverdale Bible was published; in 1537 the Great Bible; then the Geneva Bible in1560 - this is the Bible that Shakespeare would have been familiar with.

There were further revisions during Elizabeth I's reign and then in 1604 James I convened a conference to begin the process of publishing a new translation of the Bible. In 1611 the King James Bible was presented to the nation. It wasn't until the 1700's that further amendments were made and it was 1881 before the Revised Version, a new translation, was published. Since then we have had many re-workings and further translations, now there are dozens of different Bibles to choose from.

In 2011 there will be a number of events and celebrations of the King James Bible, both in our own churches and across Britain. All of this reminds us of the importance of this Holy Book, the truth contained within its pages, and the riches of its wisdom and revelation. As we read through the Bible this year, let us thank God for the inspiration and courage of those first translators. Whether we read it in the language of the early 17<sup>th</sup> century or in the language of our own time, the Word of God will never be diminished, it will always speak to our hearts.

"Thy word is a lamp unto my feet, and a light unto my path." (Psalm 119:105)

### **BODENHAM PARISH COUNCIL continued**

**Queen's Diamond Jubilee**. Celebrations for the Queen's Diamond Jubilee are to take place over an extended bank holiday weekend from Saturday  $2^{nd}$  to Tuesday  $6^{th}$  June 2012. Celebrations will be held across the country, including in Herefordshire. #### Speed Indicating Device (SID)

The SID continues to be used at several locations around the village in an attempt to draw drivers' attention to their vehicle speed. Early indications suggest that having a visual flashing reminder of the speed limit is having a beneficial effect. National statistics show that speeding along rural lanes accounts for a disproportionately large number of accidents and the purchase of a SID was intended to ensure that Bodenham does not feature in these statistics.

#### **Bus Shelters**

Grants have been sought towards the cost of replacement bus shelters along The Moor and it is hoped that the result of the application will be known shortly. It was initially thought that all that was required was the replacement of the defective reinforced-concrete roofs by timber-framed units but the Parish Council was later advised that the existing brickwork should also be removed.

### Proposed Changes to Bodenham Rights of Way (Footpaths)

Following the report in the November newsletter of the Parish Council's endorsement of proposed changes to two public footpaths in the vicinity of The Moor we were advised of objections raised by the National Ramblers Association, the Open Spaces Society and a Malvern-based group. In this situation, and in order to comply with legislation, Herefordshire Council then sought an alternative solution involving a possible diversion of part of the footpath (known as BM 13) ,that originally ran through the garden of 44 Brockington Road, via land in the ownership of the Siward James and Arkwright Trust. The Parish Council raised strong objection to this proposal and was unanimously supported in its view by members of H.C's Regulatory Committee when it met on 7<sup>th</sup> December 2010. The Public Rights of Way Manager has again been requested to revert to the earlier plan to formally seek approval to close a small section of the footpath (BM13) and for a diversion via Orchard Close. It is likely that the matter will now be referred to the Planning Inspectorate for resolution.

### Herefordshire Councillor's Report

**Budget for 2011/12.** In November, when I last wrote about the spending review and its effects there was not much detail available. Remember, I was expecting a cut of about £8.5m in our budget for next year. Herefordshire has not come out the process well and the figure is actually over £10m and this is in spite of £2.3m of NHS funds being made available for social care. Savings totalling £10.3m have been split across the Council departments which will now work on the detail. This will be presented to the full council meeting on 4 February for ratification on 4 March. This budget must shrink the size of our council to that ordained by Government over the next 2 years. Although the Comprehensive Spending Review covered 4 years, the majority of cuts are in the first 2 years so we need to be in sustainable shape in 2 years time.

First pillar – Activities funded by grants which have ended will cease. Many are in the Education area including School Travel Advisers.

Second Pillar – Save on administration before services. Thus the importance of Shared Services with the NHS making £2.56m savings.

Third Pillar – Following from this, reduce the pay bill by £3.148m.

Some headlines:

- Council Tax Freeze. In return we receive £2.15m equates to 2.5%. Assume 2.5% for 2012/13.
- Concessionary Fares & Transport. Despite representations, the transport grant has been cut by 20% not as bad as some Counties (Shropshire, Oxfordshire) although London got increases. Our Waste Management reserve will fund £1m towards this shortfall to be repaid in 12/13. Concessionary fares are a statutory obligation and we currently put no limit on time of use. This may have to be re-considered. Concessions start at 09.30 in many authorities.
- Adult Social Care. Net increase £2.5m £1.96m from grant + £2.368m from NHS + £0.75m. But £2.649m directorate savings sought.

Reserves will be retained at or above £4.5m. We can assume that many staff will not get a pay rise in 2011 or 2012 although those on less than £21,000 may get a flat rate rise of £250. Management posts are being thinned out – around 250 will go.

**Council Spending Made Public**. Since January the council has made invoices of £500 or more available to view on its website. The requirement to make this information available came from Eric Pickles, our Secretary of State for Communities and Local Government. The information includes Expenditure of £500 or more for the 2010/11 financial year to date and the Contracts Register.

The information is easy to find on the herefordshire.gov.uk website in the "Council, government & democracy" area under Transparency. Be warned, you will find an eye-watering plethora of line entries which tell you how much was spent by which department with which supplier but, you will need to contact the department to find out what was actually purchased. People are employed to generate this material – I would appreciate feedback on its utility.

**Recycling Bins For Village Halls**. Waste Management has offered, free of charge, up to 2 wheeled green recycling bins to each village hall in the county. Providing the Hall Committees agree, they should be delivered later in February and may be used by any member of the public to dispose of their recyclables, as well as the halls.

### SUPPORT FOR BUSES

Rail for Herefordshire is a voluntary organisation that campaigns for improvements to public transport in Herefordshire and has a web-site - (www.railforherefordshire.org.uk). Members are concerned that Herefordshire's rural bus network is likely to be seriously under threat and suggest that anyone who is alarmed at this prospect should speak up now.

Councillor Wilcox, the Cabinet Member responsible for transport, made a comment at a Herefordshire council meeting in November 2010 as follows:

'I am well aware of the importance of bus services and the vital access they provide to employment, education, health and other services often for the most vulnerable members of our community."

However, he has also said that with at least £1 million of grant funding being cut he could offer `no assurances' over the future for bus routes ahead of a meeting with bus operators in 2011. Clearly, budgets will be under pressure and rural buses will be an easy target. Buses may not sound exciting but they are good for the local economy. A study by the Institute of Transport and Tourism (ITT) a couple of years ago found that each passenger on a Herefordshire market day bus spent, on average, £40 on their visit to town. That adds up to millions of pounds spent on our high streets every year and for a very small support cost of less than £1 million (compare that with the spending on reports alone for the Hereford Orbital Road, a figure of £479,034!). They can be good for the environment too. When buses are moderately loaded they also reduce CO2 emissions and energy resources and many buses in Herefordshire meet that load factor.

The ITT report also revealed that local buses provided a strong social network for young people going to and from school or college and for shopping on Saturdays. They were even more important for elderly people as some market day buses were akin to mobile meeting places. Remove these services and we take away another layer of social contact, we add another barrier to independent living, and we look on as another job is lost at the local bus depot.

In 2011 Rail for Herefordshire will be devoting more attention to the provision of bus services in Herefordshire and advocating strongly that there should be no major cuts to the existing `front line' rural network. They realise that there might be instances where sensible modifications could make sense and bring savings. At the same time, they consider that the rural network is currently at a minimal level. Further cuts would be very damaging and savings would be minimal in terms of the overall transport budget.

RfH wishes to be proactive and to encourage more passengers on board so as to reduce energy use/CO2 emissions per passenger mile. They will be running a series of events to market services in 2011 and hope they will bring benefits to the local economy in a number of parishes.

Marketing by community groups can also help to reduce the need for overall financial support from the Council. Like you, we are keen to build a sustainable transport network in Herefordshire. An integral part of this network has to be our buses and there is a need to stabilise what we already have before we can go forward. The Group is keen that you join the fight for buses as they are tantamount to front line services in other sectors. They urge you to speak up for your local bus!
