Speeding

The Parish Council attempts to limit the effect that speeding vehicles have on the quality of life and safety of residents and recently arranged for the monitoring of traffic along the A417 between England's Gate and Saffron's Cross. The data provided will provide useful guidance to the Police and the Highway Authority on further measures that may be taken.

Many of you will be aware that additional sockets for mounting Speed Indicating Devices have recently been installed at various locations within the Village. Earlier monitoring, particularly along The Moor and Millcroft Road, indicates a relatively high level of speeding by local residents and we are hopeful that everyone will display a little more care and consideration.

Bus Shelters

Unfortunately it has been necessary to withdraw our two bus shelters from use after a structural survey showed that their reinforced-concrete roofs were deemed to be unsafe! Attempts are in hand to find funding sources so that repairs/replacement can proceed.

The Parish Council and Herefordshire Partnership are supporting a local Community led Plan for Bodenham. A grant has been awarded and a Local Steering Group has been set up in order to develop the Plan.

The first part of this process will be to hold a Planning For Real Event over two Weekends at the beginning of July.

Maps of the Parish will be prepared by Children from St Michael's School and the Steering Group with the help of Herefordshire Partnership. Everyone will be invited to the event and given an opportunity to put their point of view about the Parish.

Once this information is evaluated a questionnaire will be prepared and delivered to every Household in order to obtain more feedback and views.

The Steering Group with the help of Herefordshire Partnership will complete a formal analysis and an Action Plan will be produced. Local Service providers will be involved once the priorities have been set and it is hoped grants and support will be available.

The whole process will take around 12 – 18 months.

BODENHAM CHURCH GROUNDS

I am pleased to say that the above are looking good thanks in no small part to the hard work that our groundsman, Mike Stephens, puts in mowing and strimming around all the graves and trees in the Churchyard.

There are a few things I need to mention in this letter: Firstly, there are still some people who allow their dogs to run off the lead in the Churchyard, in spite of the fact that there are notices on every entrance requiring them to keep their 'DOGS ON A LEAD'. Worse still, they allow their dogs to foul in the area and not clean it up. The PCC is asking the Dog Warden to patrol the area and he can issue an on the spot fine of £60.

The PCC has upgraded the Crematoria area and tidied up some other parts of the churchyard. There is some concern whether those Burial Graves that have not been levelled should be levelled 15 months after the burial in order to facilitate easier maintenance of the area. It is the responsibility of the family to do this.

The planting of bulbs or wild flowers in the Churchyard must have the consent of the Parochial Church Council. There are some areas where planting of bulbs or wild flowers would enhance the area but please ask before doing so.

I intend to give an update of the fabric of the Church and Churchyard periodically but if anybody has any concerns please get in touch.

Last, but not least I would like to add my thanks to all the Parishioners who made the Church Fete such a Community success on June 12th, especially Vivien Moffitt, our organiser and co-ordinator. Tom James-Moore, Churchwarden.

Caring in the Community

Herefordshire Councillor's Annual Report

Annual Council Meeting, 28 May. I attended the Council's annual meeting at which we, almost unanimously, re-elected Councillor Roger Phillips to lead the Council for the next year. The business of this meeting is largely procedural with committee and cabinet appointments (mostly unchanged) and annual reports from the committees. We paid tribute to Councillors Olwyn Barnett and David Taylor – over 70 years of public service between them on this and predecessor Councils. There are always a few gems to be picked up by the more alert among us. I offer the following:

- Herefordshire has the lowest wages of any of the 14 West Midlands authorities and the gap is growing. In 2006 Herefordshire's average earnings were 6% lower than the West Midlands average (14% lower than England). Last year (2009) the figures were 9% and 23%.
- Digital TV Switchover. "Digital UK" will switch the Central TV region (includes Herefordshire) to digital next year at which point the whole region will get Freeview. They will write to every householder before the Ridge Hill transmitter switches over between 6 and 20 April 2011. We will also help with promoting this in Herefordshire Matters if asked.
- Salaries. Herefordshire Council has one employee, The Chief Executive, on a salary exceeding £150,000. It is paid 50/50 by Council and the NHS. We have 4 employees on salaries between £100,000 and £150,000, some shared 50/50 with the NHS. 4,205 employees are paid less than £15,000.
- Workforce. On 31 March 2010 the Council's workforce totalled 6,501. 3,965 of these worked in schools and many are part time on a few hours per week during term time only.
- Petitions. If you wish to raise a petition to force a debate at a full meeting of the Council you will need to have more than 7,000 signatures, around 5% of the county's electoral roll.
- School Rolls. Rolls are still falling and will probably continue to fall until 2016. They are then expected to stabilise with around 29,000 under 16s in Herefordshire 7% less than in 2008.

Finally, Forthcoming Roadworks. Resurfacing in Church Lane, Smeadles Lane and the Godalmighty Hill is due to take place between 9 and 13 August. Although provisional at this stage, please be ready for some disruption and look out for local warnings.



FROM THE ROOTS...

Our monthly update of what's going on in the gardens

This month we'll be weeding paths, beds and water features, removing dead flower heads, edging lawns, strimming, box hedge trimming, watering, feeding, sowing and harvesting.

In the kitchen garden the first half of July finds the central border looking fantastic with black peony flowered poppies (Papaver somniferum) , Cirsium rivulare 'Atropurpureum', Allium sphaerocephalon and Lettuce 'Bronze Arrow'.

We will continue to crop salad, herbs and vegetables for the Orangery Café and we anticipate that there will be plenty of broad beans, courgettes and freshly cut flowers from the kitchen garden, to be made available for sale in the gift shop as well as our own use

The sweet peas continue to climb their way up the woven willow support, their delicate perfume greeting you as you enter the garden. Picked regularly to keep them flowering throughout the season they too will often be available to buy in small bunches from the Gift Shop. The proceeds from their sale goes to FAB club (Frenchay After Burns Unit) – a charity we support due to its close connection with a member of staff.


