St Michael's Church

Dear Friends,

October is the month of Harvest Festivals, a time to give thanks to God for all his goodness to us, and to celebrate the hard work and ingenuity of farmers and agricultural scientists.

My Grandfather, on his Welsh farm would have been amazed at the huge machines that bring in the harvest, the tractors, combines and harvesters that work all through the night to pick the crop at its best. His small fields would never have held all our familiar machinery.

But however the crops are gathered, the care and concern my Grandfather had for his land and animals, his understanding of how to grow things, is the same today, and will always be the same.

When we fill our churches with flowers and vegetables, and sit down to share in a simple meal at our Harvest Celebrations, we are reminded of our dependence on the land around us, and countries far away to provide us with the food we need.

"If the land could speak, It would speak for us, It would say, like us, that the years Have forged the bond of life that ties us together. It was our labour that made her the land she is, It was her yielding that gave us life. We and the land are one! (Christian Aid, from the Philippines)

St Francis, writing in the 12th Century, wrote in his Canticle of the Sun:

"Praised be my Lord for our sister, mother earth, Who sustains and keeps us

And brings forth diverse fruits with grass and flowers bright."

In our hymn "All Creatures of our God and King", based on the Canticle of the Sun, we sing "Dear Mother Earth....."

We are sustained and kept in good health by the goodness of the soil, God calls us to be good stewards of the Earth. That means that not only should we do all we can to care for the land around us, but also make sure that wherever food is grown and harvested in the world, that the land and people there are not exploited or blighted by over production.

We pray for an equal sharing of the world's resources so that no one should go hungry, while we have so much choice and variety of food. How we produce our harvest in Britain or in places far away has an impact on our lives today and tomorrow.

"God saw everything that he had made, and indeed it was very good." (Genesis 1:31) May we do all we can to care for the earth, and the web of life that sustains us.

DINMORE SPOUT

The Parish Council has once again been notified by the Scientific Officer in the Environmental Health and Trading Standards department at Herefordshire Council that the water at the spring serving Dinmore Spout is not fit to drink. The latest inspection found different bacteria from previous inspections, namely e-coli and

enterococi. Important clinical infections caused by enterococci include urinary tract infections, bacteremia, bacterial endocarditis, diverticulitis, and meningitis. There is no safe limit for these bacteria in water supplies. You have been warned.

There are three Parish Council noticeboards - at Saffrons Garage, opposite the School and next to the playground. The Parish Council is hoping to move the noticeboard at Saffrons Garage to a more prominent position. The other two noticeboards will shortly be divided into a space for Parish Council notices only and a space for all other notices.

It's only with the generous help and support of volunteers, hosts, musicians and S&A that we are able to provide a varied programme of excursions to places of interest around the County.

This year we enjoyed 3 events locally - a visit to Amberley Court and church, a BBQ at the Gyfords in Sutton and our final evening at the Netherways to see a couple of steam engines in full steam, ending with dancing to Village Band, including of course the 'Hokey Cokey'- what else? Working without a budget, this is only possible because of the generosity of so many people. Thankyou so much to everyone who has given their time and hospitality to our groups, usually of 40-50 workers. Some readers may remember seeing some publicity about Plamen, a classically trained musician from Bulgaria unemployed as a music teacher when his school closed 4 years ago. During his stay here he sang tenor with Village Voices and introduced us to some Bulgarian music, which was performed at Leominster Priory in May. He also played some Bach on the organ at St. Andrew's Church, Moreton-on-Lugg, in a concert there in July. You may be interested to know that since returning home, he has been successful in obtaining a post as a music teacher in his home town of Gabrovo, to start 15th Sept. Plamen is one of so many workers who are highly qualified professionals coming here to work, leaving home and family, in order to make a decent living.

It is a privilege to be in their company and to be counted as a friend.

We hope that the 100s of workers who have enjoyed meeting up with some 'friendly natives', will go home with happy memories of the warm welcome they have received.

AN APPEAL FOR HELP

Aspire Living, the local charity helping people with learning disabilities, is actively looking for volunteers to support its work in Herefordshire. HEALTH CARE IN BODENHAM

The analysis of the questions relating to health and care in Bodenham showed that most people were very happy with the services from The Marches GP practice, including the District Nurse service and services provided by Domiciliary Care Agencies. While people were very appreciative that there is such a good service for a branch of the Practice, there were some suggestions of other services which could be useful in the village, and some suggestions from the GPs about how villagers could help to ensure they retained the facilities, while across the country many branch surgeries are being closed down.

A total of 79 people asked for more support for carers, which suggests that many family members or friends are helping to support and care for someone.

This number is very much higher than either the GPs know, or people who are registered with Herefordshire Carers Support, (HCS) the countywide organisation which provides information, advice and support to carers. To see what

support the carers in the village would like there will be a meeting at Siward James. Someone from HCS will come along to listen to carers and discuss what we can all do – becoming a carer can be sprung on any of us at any time so come along so you know what support is available.

Another suggestion was to provide foot care services in the village and Age UK are very interested in setting up a foot care clinic on a regular basis if there is enough demand. This service is run by trained volunteers who can carry out basic nail cutting and filing of toenails as well as checking your feet. They offer advice on how to improve and maintain skin texture and advise on general foot hygiene. There is a cost of £10 per appointment and each person will have to buy their own foot care equipment which costs about £12. We'll hope to let you know more about this in the near future.

Another question raised was about physiotherapy services, but as this is a PCT commissioning issue, and as there are good services in Hereford and Leominster, it is unlikely to be available in Bodenham.

We also discussed the possibility of the surgery being open more often – perhaps in an evening or a Saturday. At the moment the doctors don't think they have enough resources to do this, but they will keep the suggestion under consideration when they do their overall review of the

practice.

The suggestions the doctors would like to raise with patients in the village are

(i) to use the dispensary – the income from the dispensary helps to keep the branch open

(ii) to ring for a home visit before 10 in the morning and (iii) to let them know if you are caring for someone so that they can record this on your notes.

They were pleased to hear that the practice is highly valued and interested in the findings of the survey.


