The next meeting of the Parish Council is on 6^{th} September, 7.30pm at the Siward James Centre.

Childrens Play Area-Safety Report The play area near the doctors surgery has recently had its annual safety check and been given a clean bill of health by the RoSPA inspector.

Road Maintenance Recent road re-surfacing activity in Smeadals Lane and Church Road is very welcome. In particular the Parish Council has been pushing for action to improve Church Road and it is also hoped that dwarf oak posts will be installed shortly to protect the grass verges from damage caused by inconsiderate parking of vehicles. Residents will also notice that pot holes elsewhere within the village have been attended to.

Wood House Lane Difficulty in negotiating the junction of Wood House Lane with the main road (A417) has been the subject of long standing concern and was highlighted recently when the existing traffic mirror was replaced by a new, larger, convex version. The Parish Council again raised this matter and now note that, following further careful adjustment, visibility towards Saffron's Cross is marginally improved. It has to be accepted that the local topography and junction alignment mean that emerging from Wood House Lane will always require extreme caution but it is felt that reasonable steps have been taken to improve the situation. The Parish Council is grateful to those residents who raised this matter

The Steering Group would like to thank everyone who attended and participated in the two Planning For Real Event weekends, with special thanks to the Schoolchildren and teachers at St Michael's School.

286 people attended the events and a total of 347 topics raised. The Steering Group are now busy analyzing the details and will prepare a questionnaire for all residents of the parish in order that we can prioritize the important issues and seek support and help for our Action

Plan.

The questionnaire will be delivered to every household within the next two months.

One of the initial benefits from the Event, was to improve communication within the parish and we would like to advise on some of the items, which were raised, which are already happening within our community.

Herefordshire Councillor's Annual Report

Council Leadership after May 2011. This might be important! One of the hand grenades left to go off after Labour's general election defeat was the "Local Government and Public Involvement in Health Act 2007." This requires us to adopt different executive arrangements from next May 2011 following our local council elections. Aimed at strengthening leadership in local councils, the act limits the options for elected leadership to just 2. Currently we have the "Leader and Cabinet" model with the Leader elected annually by the council. Normally this is straightforward as the leader of the largest political group on the council is the only one likely to secure a majority. As from next May the options are:

Elected Mayor and Cabinet. The directly-elected Mayor would serve 4 years and could only be removed with great difficulty.

Leader and Cabinet. The Leader would be elected by the Council but for a 4 year term. Council would be able to remove the Leader. As currently, I guess the Council Leader would normally be the leader of the largest political group represented on the council.

Under either model, Leader or Mayor would appoint the executive (Cabinet) of up to 10, remove Cabinet Members when appropriate and be responsible for all executive functions.

As usual, there is an obligation to "consult" so I regret this will once again be done against the clock! Parish Councillors will know what I mean. Council must pass a resolution to adopt the change by 31 December. Practically, that means it must be done at the Council meeting on 19 November. On 22 July, the Cabinet was not enthusiastic about the change but recognised that we need to press on with consultations.

Perhaps the key question to consider is which model is most likely to secure the best functional control in terms of economy, efficiency and effectiveness?

Sorry, a bit yucky this month, but this stuff is red meat to the political aficionados!

HEREFORDSHIRE COUNCILLOR'S REPORT

ENVIROSORT

I recently visited EnviroSort, near Worcester, so can tell you something about what happens to our green bin and clear bag recycling. The site at Norton was originally a jam factory. The plant is inside an enormous building measuring 110 x 65 metres. All vehicles are unloaded inside the building. It is known as a Co-Mingled Materials Reclamation Facility (CMRF) and is a unique design worked up by Mercia Waste and others to meet the specific needs of Herefordshire and Worcestershire. As you know, it separates and sorts the mixed contents of our bins – paper, cardboard, plastics, waxed cartons, cans and glass. The sorting system is hi-tech and there is an excellent animation on www.envirosort.co.uk Hit "The Process" button to see the 3 minute show which tells you that the paper is the first element separated by Ballistic Sorting. This process relies on the bulkiness of items like cans and bottles which is why you shouldn't squash them. Next, steel and aluminium cans are removed from the stream by magnets and eddy current. Finally an optical sorter separates the different plastics. This does not work with black plastic – hence the request to exclude it from your bins. The industry is working with Government to get food suppliers to stop using black plastic. Finally, please remove bottle tops as a help to squashing the bottles when they are finally baled.

Most of the site's output goes to UK factories. Waxed paper however goes to Orebro in Sweden; one of the very few plants in Europe that takes this material.

The use of most recycled material is straightforward, but recycled plastic products are not generally well known. Try the website <u>www.britishrecycledproducts.co.uk</u> for some ideas like fence posts and garden furniture. Might this be a useful article for "Herefordshire Matters"?

The CMRF handles about 82 vehicles per day and can process 30 tonnes an hour, or 105,000 tonnes a year, the tonnage expected in 2028. Let's keep them busy!

THOSE RECYCLING BINS:

Have you ever looked at your green recycling bin, with its mixed contents of paper, plastics, cans and bottles, and wondered how on Earth it's possible to sort it at the other end? In June representatives of 4 local Parish Councils made a visit to the Envirosort facility in Worcester, and found out just how the system works.

Herefordshire produces 60 tons of recyclable waste every day, and this amount can be processed in just two hours.

Once a consignment of 'raw material' reaches the site it is loaded onto one of a number of conveyor belts which together stretch for over a mile. A visual check is made to remove anything obviously unsuitable for recycling. This can include electrical equipment, children's toys and even a pig's head. (!) The process is then largely automatic and is based on the properties of the various recyclables using technology developed from Potato grading machines.

Newspapers, magazines and items such as envelopes tend to be flat and can simply be carried away on a vertical conveyor and are then sorted and baled. Three dimensional objects such as bottles, plastics and cans fall away onto another conveyor and then head off in a different direction. Sensors can 'read' the composition of the various types of plastic, and complicated computer software operates puffs of air at just the right moment to send them off the conveyor and into their appropriate container. Magnets and other devices are used to extract metal cans. Whatever is left after all that will be glass, and this too has a dedicated route through the plant. All this waste material is wanted by someone, somewhere, and there is a ready market for it. The system works, but it could be better!

Some people either don't understand the system or seem to regard the green recycling bins as an extension of their weekly black bag. They fill their bin with everyday household waste which holds up the system and means that time has to be spent clearing out the unwanted items.

The green bins are for all categories of paper, which even includes those envelopes with the plastic address windows. They are for all types of cardboard, although the inner packaging should be removed. They are for food tins and drink cans, glass bottles and jars, plastic bottles and containers and they can even take cartons of the kind used for milk, soup and custard.

Tins, cans, bottles, containers and cartons should be rinsed before they're put in the bin. They should not be squashed as this will interfere with the automatic recognition process, but lids, corks, caps, tops, film and foil should be taken off. The one no-no, apparently, is anything made of black plastic. This includes Food trays, packing materials and suchlike. In case you were wondering, the sorting equipment cannot 'read' black plastic, so it has to be rejected by hand at an early stage.
