Hedge cutting

You must not cut hedgerows or trees during the bird nesting season between 1st March and 31st July, but you can carry out hedge laying and coppicing from 1 March until 30 April. Orchards are not included in the ban.

THURSDAY 7 MAY 2015 ELECTIONS

Most people will be aware that the General Election is to be held on Thursday 7 May 2015. However, in Herefordshire there will also be elections for the 53 seats on Herefordshire Council and approximately 1200 seats on the 137 Town/Parish Councils. All existing councillors must seek re-election if they wish to remain as a Councillor.

With regard to Town/Parish Councils anyone can stand as a Councillor if they are at least 18 years old, they are a British citizen, an eligible Commonwealth citizen or a citizen of any other member state of the European Union. In addition candidates must meet at least one of the following qualifications:

- You are, and will continue to be, registered as a local government elector for the parish/community in which you wish to stand
- You have occupied as owner or tenant any land or other premises in the parish/community during the whole 12 months before the day of your nomination and the day of election
- Your main or only place of work during the 12 months prior to the day of nomination and the day of election has been in the parish/community
- You have lived in the parish/community or within 3 miles of it during the whole 12 months before the day of nomination and the day of election

In addition to the qualifications to stand for election there are also a few reasons that would disqualify someone seeking election and that is if you are employed by the Council, you are the subject of a bankruptcy restrictions order or interim order, you have been imprisoned for 3 months (including suspended sentence) and finally you have been found guilty of corrupt or illegal election practices.

So, subject to the above qualifications/disqualification anyone with an interest in their local community can seek election to their local Town/Parish Council.

If you are interested and would be comfortable in speaking at Council meetings that are open to the public and have the time to attend meetings and support the work of your local Town/Parish Council then why not put yourself forward. You only need 2 local people to support your nomination. It really is as simple as that.

If there are more candidates than vacancies, then an election will be held on the same day as the General Election and the Herefordshire Council Election. If there are less candidates than there are vacancies you would be elected unopposed.

You do not need to belong to a political party to become a councillor.

You will find guidance about becoming a councillor on the Electoral Commission website and the Clerk to your local Town/Parish Council can provide you with the appropriate nomination paper. Alternatively you can contact the Elections Office at Herefordshire Council on 01432 260107.

Your vote matters make sure you're in.

The way you register to vote has changed. Up until now, the head of a household has been responsible for registering everyone who lives at an address. However, since June 2014 people in England and Wales have needed to register as individuals.

In August 2014 we were able to move 86% of those registered voters in Herefordshire onto the new register automatically after checking their details with the Department for Work and Pensions. But for various reasons the remaining 14% of electors on the register did not match and all now have to re-register to vote ahead of the General Election on May 7th 2015.

If you are one of those whose details did not match the information help by the Department for Work and Pensions then you would have received a letter from the Elections Office at Herefordshire Council asking you to register individually. If you have received a letter asking you to register individually this means that you will need to re-register in order to be able to vote by post in the May election.

If you have recently moved, you must register to vote at your new address. You are not registered at a new property automatically, even if you pay council tax. The simplest way to register is online at: www.gov.uk/register-to-vote or to call 01432 260107.

NEIGHBOURHOOD PLAN UPDATE

Despite appearances to the contrary, the Neighbourhood Plan Steering Group has been working behind the scenes on the next stage of the development of Bodenham's Plan.

Following the Neighbourhood Plan Survey last September/ October, we arranged for Data Orchard CIC to conduct an independent analysis of the responses and to report on their findings. They did this before Christmas and you can find a copy of their Report on the home page of the Parish Website under 'Latest Notices'.

The Data Orchard Report is a detailed and lengthy document and, when reading it, it is not always easy to see the wood for the trees'. The Steering Group has therefore spent the past few weeks in preparing a summary of the Report's findings and in drawing key conclusions from them. That work has now been completed and you can find the draft 'Summary and Conclusions' document on the Parish Website, again under 'Local Notices'.

If you do not have access to the internet and wish to see copies of the documents mentioned above, please contact Tony Mitcheson on 01568-797170 or David Tilford on 01568-797658.

Before we finalise the 'Summary and Conclusions' we would welcome any comments you may have on it, so long as these are confined strictly to the document itself and its interpretation of the Data Orchard analysis. You can send any such comments to Tony Mitcheson at BabsMitcheson@aol.com or to David Tilford at davidtilford@greenbee. net or let us have them in person at the next public Meeting of the Steering Group which is planned for 7.30pm on Tuesday, 10 March in the Parish Hall.

Once completed, the final version of the 'Summary and Conclusions' will be used, with the help of our planning consultant, to inform the next draft of the Neighbourhood Plan.

Herefordshire Wildlife Trust

Queenswood and Bodenham Lake to be safeguarded by Herefordshire Wildlife Trust and New Leaf

Local organisations Herefordshire Wildlife Trust and New Leaf Sustainable Development Ltd are confirming that they have formed a partnership specifically to safeguard the long-term future of iconic Herefordshire beauty spots Queenswood and Bodenham Lake.

Herefordshire Council have also confirmed their intention, subject to public consultation, to transfer the management responsibility of both the Queenswood Country Park and adjacent Bodenham Lake nature reserve to the partnership, while retaining both in public ownership, via a 99 year leasehold 'community asset transfer'.

The partnership intends to seek external funding for much needed investment in both sites. Plans include improved visitor facilities at Queenswood, where it also wants to initiate an environmental education programme whilst developing the current woodland management for the benefit of both people and wildlife. All of this will be done whilst retaining the essence of this high-profile site. Meanwhile, Bodenham Lake will continue to be managed as a nature reserve, ensuring the site retains its status as a wildlife haven.

The partnership have also confirmed, after discussion with Herefordshire Council - who will continue to own the freehold of the sites - that there is no prospect of housing developments or the sale of land within the sites.

Herefordshire Wildlife Trust (HWT) is the largest member based nature conservation organisation in the county, with over 50 years experience of managing nature reserves. The charity has nearly 5,000 members, mostly living in Herefordshire. New Leaf is a not-for-profit co-operative, promoting sustainable development in Herefordshire. The intention of the partnership is that these two important sites will increasingly showcase the best of our county – by promoting local food, crafts and woodland produce. A creative demonstration of how nature, human wellbeing and social enterprise can flourish together.

Evan Bowen-Jones, HWT chief executive welcomes the move, stating: "This partnership draws on the best of HWT and New Leaf, ensuring continued investment in Queenswood as one of the counties best outdoor leisure areas and most important woodlands, with Bodenham Lake as a highly-valued local nature reserve. We look forward to working with local people to develop and implement an exciting program of wildlife enhancement and family activities at hoth sites

HWT is privileged to have such a fantastic opportunity to ensure that young and old can continue to enjoy two of Herefordshire's best loved sites by reinvesting income generated on-site back into the areas themselves."

Rob Garner, Director of New Leaf says: "After a long series of discussions, we are delighted that the Council has now come to a decision. This opens the way for us to work closely with local communities and to develop and implement a shared vision for the sites.

We hope to be able to launch our "Supporters of Queenswood and Bodenham Lake" scheme in April, which will enable local people to get more involved in the day-to-day running and future development of these beautiful places.

The Friends of Bodenham Lake

Dear Friends of Bodenham Lake and Queenswood.

The Friends of Bodenham Lake (as was), have proposed and successfully managed the listing of Bodenham Lake as an asset of community value. This status as a special asset, allows us, the communities of and around Bodenham, to put in a bid to ourselves take on a lease of the lake. We are now in a six week period in which we can indicate our interest if we so choose.

This is obviously a big undertaking. Why would we do this? There was extensive discussion of this among the people who attended the latest meetings of the Friends group, (which I apologise was rather hurriedly pulled together in response to the latest story, in the Hereford Times).

The concerns focus on lack of community engagement by New Leaf and the Council. Lack of openness from councillors and the secretive nature with which the council conducts itself. These are not times to be secretive. People wish to know what is happening and crucially, why.

Alive to this fact, and very much wanting to know what is going to happen to our beloved lake myself, I have done my best, among the rigours of daily family life to prize out the answers. Why are New Leaf the council's preferred partner? Why were Herefordshire Nature Trust not involved from the beginning, or not offered the lakes themselves? Why were we not aware of the transfer until told by The Hereford Times or for many, by our own Friends Group. And, assuming the community of Bodenham was as in the dark as me (most were), I founded a community group, The Friends of Bodenham Lake and Queenswood.

It has been a lot of work. I have done this in the name of openness and transparency and because we who live by this lake, wish to engage with its care and future more fully than is currently possible. We have no way of knowing if it will be possible in the future. And when the lease has been granted, the control will have been decisively taken out of our hands. If the community take on the lease, we can of course approach appropriate partners, which may include New leaf or the Nature Trust, the RSPB, or other organisations. The point is that we will be in control rather than an outside body. This may seem attractive but with control comes responsibility!

As I write I am aware that other people's lives are also busy and full, and running a lake may be an undertaking too far! And I would rather find a positive way forward. But I do believe that we should be given the chance to discuss this properly, even if we decide not to go for it. For this reason I am calling a public meeting of The Friends of Bodenham Lake and Queenswood on March 17th in the Village Hall in Bodenham at 7.30pm.

I am hoping New Leaf and Herefordshire Nature Trust will be in attendance and we can properly discuss their plans for community engagement. We will vote on whether to bid as a community that evening.

Other concerns focus on the length of the lease. Ninety nine years is a very long time. I am also working hard to ensure that the council reinstate a covenant on the lake protecting it in perpetuity as public open space and wildlife reserve. The existing covenant has expired.

Right at this very moment, we have the chance to negotiate a real level of community engagement, assuming we want it. So what do people want for and from the lake? I very much hope this is enough notice and you can come to our meeting and that we can find a way of truly having our voices heard, and protecting the wildlife of this area, now and into the future.
