The RDPE Countryside Productivity Small Grant Scheme Round 2 is now open

The scheme provides funding for farmers to purchase equipment to improve the productivity of their farm. This scheme is only open to farmers based in England.

Farmers can apply for funding towards specific items of equipment listed at Annex 3 of the Countryside Productivity Small Grants Scheme Round 2 handbook.

All the items have been identified following consultation with industry groups and suppliers as helping achieve improvements in either:

- technical efficiency
- animal health and welfare
- resource efficiency, or
- nutrient management

Who can apply

Farmers in England (including livestock, dairy, arable and horticultural sectors) can apply for this grant.

This monthly feature has been introduced into the Hub newsletter to provide insight into some of the local funding initiatives. Many have an interesting history that goes back over many years and these funds have supported farming and rural businesses for training and development.

Herefordshire's Prince's Countryside Fund for training

Over the past 3 Years Herefordshire Rural Hub has worked in partnership with the Herefordshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs (HFYFC) to successfully deliver a Prince's Countryside Fund project. This has provided funding support for current HFYFC members and past members who have undertaken training. To date 180 past and present HFYFC members have had applications approved and there are still funds available for further applications. The funding is easy to access. Applicants must be a member of HFYFC (aged 10yrs – 26yrs) or a past HFYFC member (27 – 40 yrs). If you are eligible then all you need to do is select which course you would like to go on and complete the application form. You will be notified within 1 month if you have been successful or not. If your application is approved you will be able to reclaim 70% of your training and test costs, up to a maximum of £250. Training will not be funded retrospectively, so please apply in good time before your training is due. The fund will support training that will; improve your employability, increase or improve your skill set, improve your safety or allow you to undertake extra responsibility in your current job.

- If you abstract or impound water or plan to do so, you may need to apply for an abstraction or impoundment licence.
- If you used to abstract water under an exemption, you must apply for a new licence (also known as a new authorisation).

 You must apply before 31 December 2019. Please apply as soon as you can so that the Environment Agency has enough time to accept and validate it before 31 December 2019

Natural Flood Management: Our advisers are working with landowners in target catchments to help deliver Natural Flood Management interventions through a DEFRA funded project. The target catchments are the Dulas, Bodenham, Pentaloe, Tedstone, Cheaton, Ridgemore and Red/Twyford Brook. The project is run in partnership with Herefordshire Council and we can offer soil structure assessments, infiltration rate tests, worm counts and organic matter testing. Metaldehyde: It was recently announced that Metaldehyde will be banned from 2020. It has been a concern in the Wye for many years due to its impact on Drinking Water abstractions belonging to Severn Trent lower down the catchment. We are asking users to continue to follow safe spreading and handling procedures with any Metaldehyde based slug pellets they have left to use up during this transition period. Alternative products which use ferric phosphate as the active ingredient are just as effective for slug control thankfully!

The Prince's Countryside Fund

The Herefordshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs (HFYFC) working in partnership with Herefordshire Rural Hub have secured funding to provide support for training in a rurally based career to the end of December 2019. The funding is easy to access. All you need to do is select which course you would like to go on and complete the application form. If your application is approved you will be able to reclaim 70% of your training and test costs, up to a maximum of £250. Applicants must be a current member of HFYFC or a past HFYFC member (up to 40 yrs old).

The fund will support training that will; *improve your employability, increase or improve your skill set, improve your safety or allow you to undertake extra responsibility in your current job.*

Some examples of training that has been funded so far:-

B+E Trailer, Chainsaw Certification, Pesticide Applications, Shearing, Artificial Insemination, Tractor Driving, Forklift Truck Driving

You could even apply for funding towards a Rodent Control course

Whatever training you are applying for, please ensure that you submit your application in good time before your course is due to take place, as training cannot be funded retrospectively.

Please note, the appraisal panel meets on the first Monday of the month.

The Jack Hughes Fund - administered by Herefordshire Community Foundation

The Jack Hughes Fund will fund up to a maximum of 70% pf the cost of training or costs up to a maximum of £150. Funding will be limited to one family member/employee per annum

The programme will be available for farmers $\underline{\mathsf{aged}}\ \mathsf{over}\ \mathsf{40}$

and will specifically provide funds to support those who require:

- retraining or upskilling as they are leaving the industry
- training to support a new farm diversification enterprise
- training or business support for succession planning

Funding will also be available for the following courses:

- Safe use of pesticides PA1, PA2, PA6
- Rodent control on farms
- Emergency first aid
- Food safety (Basic Food Hygiene)
- Chainsaw Maintenance & Cross Cutting (CS30)

The funding is easy to access, but please note that the project will not support training retrospectively & places will be limited.

From Paul Crumpton, West Mercia Police – on Rural & Business Crime

A couple of weeks ago I spent an evening with a very select group from the Institute of Agricultural Secretaries and Administrators at the NFU offices in Hereford. My 1hr input rapidly turned into 2hrs as we discussed Fraud & Cybercrime and how it might affect

- i. them as individuals
- ii. their businesses.

Nearly £25M was lost across West Mercia from around 10,000 reported Fraud & Cybercrimes crimes alone in the last 12mths. (and that's just the incidents that were reported)

I think it fair to say the input and discussions were well received and were hosted by the Rural Hub in partnership with the Fastershire project. If this is something you would wish to see more of, do not hesitate to contact the Hub as Frances & Caron would be very pleased to hear from you.
