Herefordshire LEADER Programme enhancing local economies

£1,709,214.34 funding allocated to Herefordshire businesses, over 50 created jobs forecast, and 68 projects for the benefit of the wider local economy, for example builders, carpenters and trades. This is an overview of how the Herefordshire LEADER programme has successfully infused the local rural economy and has changed the lives of many Herefordshire-based entrepreneurs.

The LEADER programme, funded by the EU, has focused efforts on farm productivity, small enterprises and diversification, tourism, rural services, cultural and heritage activity and forestry.

The focus of the three-year LEADER programme was to sustain and support the development of longer-term business growth and job creation.

Water Abstraction licences

- If you abstract or impound water or plan to do so, you may need to apply for an abstraction or impoundment licence.
- If you used to abstract water under an exemption, you must apply for a new licence (also known as a new authorisation).

 You must apply before 31 December 2019. Please apply as soon as you can so that the Environment Agency has enough time to accept and validate it before 31 December 2019

The Environment Agency has established a free hotline and bookable appointments service to help previously exempt abstractors complete their New Authorisation application forms by 1 October in order to meet the deadline of 31/12/2019. The dedicated team will be supporting New Authorisations applicants by:

- answering any specific questions you may have
- helping you to decide if you need to apply for a licence
- talking you through completing your application form
- arranging a convenient call-back time to take them through their application

The Wye & Usk Foundation – Here to Help

Natural Flood Management: Our advisers are working with landowners in target catchments to help deliver Natural Flood Management interventions through a DEFRA funded project. The target catchments are the Dulas, Bodenham, Pentaloe, Tedstone, Cheaton, Ridgemore and Red/Twyford Brook. The project is run in partnership with Herefordshire Council and we can offer soil structure assessments, infiltration rate tests, worm counts and organic matter testing. Metaldehyde: It was recently announced that Metaldehyde will be banned from 2020. It has been a concern in the Wye for many years due to its impact on Drinking Water abstractions belonging to Severn Trent lower down the catchment. We are asking users to continue to follow safe spreading and handling procedures with any Metaldehyde based slug pellets they have left to use up during this transition period. Alternative products which use ferric phosphate as the active ingredient are just as effective for slug control thankfully!

Stewardship Schemes: Agreement offers are slowly trickling out for the schemes applied for last summer, if we assisted with your application and you would like us to check your agreement document please contact your adviser. We are also already getting requests for 2019 scheme applications – start thinking about it now and give us a call if you'd like us to help!

Carers Trust 4all support unpaid carers of all ages by offering a number of services across Cheshire & Warrington, Greater Manchester, Merseyside, Shropshire and Herefordshire. In Herefordshire, they provide an information and advice service called CarerLinks to support individuals who are new to caring for someone or for existing carers who need additional support.

Lyme disease is becoming an increasing health problem in the UK There is a petition circulating to try to get a "Lyme Centre of Excellence" set up

Endemic in the UK, with an est. 3,000 new cases a year, Lyme disease can cause tremendous suffering to some patients, each requiring an individualised holistic plan of care which no other speciality can give.

Sufferers with ongoing symptoms see multiple, inexperienced Doctors, costing the NHS thousands in various wasted appointments/investigations. Many are unable to work full-time.

Referral to a Specialist in the Centre, experienced and trained in Lyme disease would have the ability to manage all aspects of the disease effectively and efficiently.

The Prince's Countryside Fund

The Herefordshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs (HFYFC) working in partnership with Herefordshire Rural Hub have secured funding to provide support for training in a rurally based career to the end of December 2019. The funding is easy to access. All you need to do is select which course you would like to go on and complete the application form. If your application is approved you will be able to reclaim 70% of your training and test costs, up to a maximum of £250. Applicants must be a current member of HFYFC or a past HFYFC member (up to 40 yrs old).

The fund will support training that will; *improve your employability, increase or improve your skill set, improve your safety or allow you to undertake extra responsibility in your current job.*

Some examples of training that has been funded so far:-

B+E Trailer, Chainsaw Certification, Pesticide Applications, Shearing, Artificial Insemination, Tractor Driving, Forklift Truck Driving

You could even apply for funding towards a Rodent Control course

Whatever training you are applying for, please ensure that you submit your application in good time before your course is due to take place, as training cannot be funded retrospectively.

Please note, the appraisal panel meets on the first Monday of the month.

The Jack Hughes Fund - administered by Herefordshire Community Foundation

The Jack Hughes Fund will fund up to a maximum of 70% pf the cost of training or costs up to a maximum of £150. Funding will be limited to one family member/employee per annum

The programme will be available for farmers <u>aged over 40</u> and will specifically provide funds to support those who

require:

- retraining or upskilling as they are leaving the industry
- training to support a new farm diversification enterprise
- training or business support for succession planning

Funding will also be available for the following courses:

- Safe use of pesticides PA1, PA2, PA6
- Rodent control on farms
- Emergency first aid
- Food safety (Basic Food Hygiene)
- Chainsaw Maintenance & Cross Cutting (CS30)

The funding is easy to access, but please note that the project will not support training retrospectively & places will be limited.
