This monthly feature is being introduced into the Hub newsletter to provide insight into some of the local funding initiatives. Many have an interesting history that goes back over many years and these funds have supported farming and rural businesses for training and development.

Herefordshire Corn Exchange Fund has supported agriculture in the County for the last 160 years.

The actual beginnings of the Herefordshire Corn Exchange charitable trust were recorded in 1859 and this year sees the 160th annual general meeting of the trustees and committee members. The current trust fund was set up from the proceeds of the sale of the Kemble Theatre in Broad Street, Hereford in 1954 for the sum of £12,000 and it is the income from this investment that is annually handed out in grants. The Trust has one key objective in the distribution of the funds and that is for the money to be used for the "encouragement and advancement of agriculture in the city and county of Hereford" and to this end has helped hundreds of local people and organisations over the years.

There is a varied list of beneficiaries ranging from Herefordshire farm employees nominated for their Three Counties Show Long Service Awards, support for local ploughing societies and funding for individual applicants who are developing and furthering their careers in agriculture.

Two recent recipients from the Herefordshire Corn Exchange Fund are:

Fergus Hawkins, who used the funding to support his travels in Australia and New Zealand and says "I used the funds to pursue small research projects and upon returning I believe this was a contributing factor in my successful application to agronomy graduate schemes. Now I have established myself as an agronomist in Herefordshire I look back on this as having added huge value to my career and my future."

Beth Hanson, whilst a student at Harper Adams University, used the grant to assist in gathering data for her dissertation. She says "the grant was very generous from the Hereford Corn Exchange and greatly helped me in being able to undertake my dissertation survey to the extent required. Without the Herefordshire Corn Exchange support I would have had to limit my research which would have limited results and not provided a true representation. The books which I bought with the remaining funds were of great help during my final year at university, helping to achieve my 1st class honours degree in Rural Enterprise and Land Management, and continue to assist me in my career as a Rural Chartered Surveyor. I would thoroughly recommend anyone to apply to the HCE for financial support".

Lyme disease is becoming an increasing health problem in the UK There is a petition circulating to try to get a "Lyme Centre of Excellence" set up

NICE guidelines (2018) suggest referring complicated Lyme Disease sufferers to a Specialist. A referral is often made to other specialities who do not have the knowledge or experience to manage this debilitating disease of multi-systemic symptoms. Endemic in the UK, with an est. 3,000 new cases a year, Lyme disease can cause tremendous suffering to some patients, each requiring an individualised holistic plan of care which no other speciality can give.

Sufferers with ongoing symptoms see multiple, inexperienced Doctors, costing the NHS thousands in various wasted appointments/investigations. Many are unable to work full-time.

Referral to a Specialist in the Centre, experienced and trained in Lyme disease would have the ability to manage all aspects of the disease effectively and efficiently.

The Wye & Usk Foundation – Here to Help

Natural Flood Management: Our advisers are working with landowners in target catchments to help deliver Natural Flood Management interventions through a DEFRA funded project. The target catchments are the Dulas, Bodenham, Pentaloe, Tedstone, Cheaton, Ridgemore and Red/Twyford Brook. The project is run in partnership with Herefordshire Council and we can offer soil structure assessments, infiltration rate tests, worm counts and organic matter testing. Metaldehyde: It was recently announced that Metaldehyde will be banned from 2020. It has been a concern in the Wye for many years due to its impact on Drinking Water abstractions belonging to Severn Trent lower down the catchment. We are asking users to continue to follow safe spreading and handling procedures with any Metaldehyde based slug pellets they have left to use up during this transition period. Alternative products which use ferric phosphate as the active ingredient are just as effective for slug control thankfully!

Stewardship Schemes: Agreement offers are slowly trickling out for the schemes applied for last summer, if we assisted with your application and you would like us to check your agreement document please contact your adviser. We are also already getting requests for 2019 scheme applications – start thinking about it now and give us a call if you'd like us to help!

The Prince's Countryside Fund

The Herefordshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs (HFYFC) working in partnership with Herefordshire Rural Hub have secured funding to provide support for training in a rurally based career to the end of December 2019. The funding is easy to access. All you need to do is select which course you would like to go on and complete the application form. If your application is approved you will be able to reclaim 70% of your training and test costs, up to a maximum of £250. Applicants must be a current member of HFYFC or a past HFYFC member (up to 40 yrs old).

The fund will support training that will; *improve your employability, increase or improve your skill set, improve your safety or allow you to undertake extra responsibility in your current job.*

Some examples of training that has been funded so far:-

B+E Trailer, Chainsaw Certification, Pesticide Applications, Shearing, Artificial Insemination, Tractor Driving, Forklift Truck Driving

You could even apply for funding towards a Rodent Control course

Whatever training you are applying for, please ensure that you submit your application in good time before your course is due to take place, as training cannot be funded retrospectively.

Please note, the appraisal panel meets on the first Monday of the month.

The Jack Hughes Fund - administered by Herefordshire Community Foundation

The Jack Hughes Fund will fund up to a maximum of 70% pf the cost of training or costs up to a maximum of £150. Funding will be limited to one family member/employee per annum

The programme will be available for farmers <u>aged over 40</u> and will specifically provide funds to support those who require:

- retraining or upskilling as they are leaving the industry
- training to support a new farm diversification enterprise
- training or business support for succession planning

Funding will also be available for the following courses:

- Safe use of pesticides PA1, PA2, PA6
- Rodent control on farms
- Emergency first aid
- Food safety (Basic Food Hygiene)
- Chainsaw Maintenance & Cross Cutting (CS30)

The funding is easy to access, but please note that the project will not support training retrospectively & places will be limited.

How do I do that? – Through talks, presentations, events, shows or by visits to you at your home, farm, business etc where I will conduct a bespoke crime reduction survey with youand anywhere in Herefordshire.

I bring 34yrs experience of what works and what does not as well as being trained in crime reduction methods.
