Farmers urged to rally behind Red Tractor advertising campaign

Red Tractor Assurance is calling on the whole farming industry to get behind its first ever national television advertising campaign which launches in mid-September.

Explaining to consumers what the logo stands for is the main thrust of the advert with the ultimate goal of encouraging more shoppers to buy Red Tractor assured products.

Market research shows most consumers recognise the logo but about half understand the standards behind it.

Those who do understand are twice as likely to buy a product bearing the logo.

Farmers are being called upon to harness the opportunity to talk about farm-assured food and increase the reach of the campaign as widely as possible.

Spearheaded by the television advert, the campaign will be synchronised and across magazines, websites and social media channels.

This includes a VAT notice explaining the MTD rules and the digital information they require businesses to keep, and a list of software developers who have MTD software that is ready for testing. MTD will require most businesses operating above the VAT threshold to keep digital records for VAT purposes from April 2019.

RDPE Countryside Productivity Scheme

Funding for projects in England which improve productivity in the farming & forestry sectors & help create jobs and growth in the rural economy. It is administered by the RPA. Under the RDPE Countryside Productivity Scheme, there are grants for:

Improving Farm Productivity (application deadline 3rd December 2018)

Grants to fund projects that improve farm productivity through the use of robotic equipment and systems to aid crop and livestock production; increasing the use of renewable energy produced on farm; the use of LED wavelength controlled lighting to aid crop production; more efficient use of livestock slurries and manures, and digestate.

The Prince's Countryside Fund

The Herefordshire Federation of Young Farmers' Clubs (HFYFC) working in partnership with Herefordshire Rural Hub have secured funding to provide support for training in a rurally based career to the end of December 2019. The funding is easy to access. All you need to do is select which course you would like to go on and complete the application form. If your application is approved you will be able to reclaim 70% of your training and test costs, up to a maximum of £250. Applicants must be a current member of HFYFC or a past HFYFC member (up to 40 yrs old).

The fund will support training that will; *improve your employability, increase or improve your skill set, improve your safety or allow you to undertake extra responsibility in your current job.*

The appraisal panel meets on the first Monday of the month. **Please ensure that you submit your application in good time** before your course is due to take place, as training cannot be funded retrospectively.

The Jack Hughes Fund - administered by Herefordshire Community Foundation

- There have always been scammers out to empty your pockets, but with the age of the internet, they've managed to get even more clever into tricking you out of your cash.
- Your identity is valuable. Fraudsters know this. They can use the information you share online to pretend to be you and apply for bank accounts, mobile phones, loans or a wide range of other products or services in your name.
- As a victim of identity fraud, you might not realise you've been targeted until a bill arrives for something you didn't buy, or you experience problems with your credit rating, for example. To carry out this kind of fraud successfully, fraudsters usually have access to their victim's personal information, which they obtain in a variety of ways such as through hacking and data loss, as well as using social media to put the pieces of someone's identity together.
- Did you know 88% of fraudulent applications for bank accounts and financial products are made online?
