Rural Watch Newsletter

Good Evening folks,

There has been a further theft from a vehicle on our patch near Edwyn Ralph. Offenders have made their way across a field, used some kind of key to open doors and have made off the same way with all the tools from within the vehicle. The offenders have pretty much cleaned out all of the tools, regardless of worth. This type of crime is happening all across Herefordshire, so please spread the word to any workman you know.

If you have no choice but to leave tools in your vehicle overnight, there are a couple of things you should consider.

- 1. If you are able to, reverse your vehicle into a parking space against a wall/garage door.
- 2. Ensure you have good security lighting/CCTV covering the area.

3. Property mark your items making them unique to you. Smartwater property marking kits are available at a discounted rate through our website, search for 'We don't buy crime' and there is a link on the page for smartwater. A marker pen or UV pen are just as good and can be a visible deterrent.

4. Register your items for free on <u>www.immobilise.com</u>

5. Check your vehicle insurance policy covers you for the quantity of tools that you have stored in the vehicle and for the real cost of those tools. Also that the insurance company takes into account where the vehicle is being parked overnight.

6. Most of the tools stored in vehicles are worth a considerable amount of money, so it may be worth investing in extra security for your vehicle such as armoured style locks, especially considering offenders have been using keys/fobs bought online which are available to all.

Incidents of note

Incident 0670-S-120917. A bike was stolen from an extension to a property near Bodenham. The bike was left insecure and stolen overnight, but nothing was seen.

Incident 0345-S-210917. The theft of a Land rover which I reported via Rural Watch Alert. Please consider crook locks or other methods of security for Land Rovers, as these are still regularly stolen in the rural areas.

Incident 0152-S-250917. A padlock was damaged to an outbuilding at a farm property in Docklow. Although offenders gained entry to the building, nothing was moved or stolen.

Incident 0559-S-280917.An attempted burglary was reported for an outbuilding in Stoke Lacy. Offenders have been disturbed after an audible alarm sounded, but they have still managed to cause considerable damage to doors etc.

Suspicious incident

Please ring any suspicious incident/vehicles or people through to us on 101 as and when they happen. It sounds corny, but you really are the eyes and ears of the community and you are best placed to say whether it is suspicious or not. Never think it is wasting our time, offenders can't see who has tools in their vehicles in the dark.....they are mostly out looking in day light hours. Please be vigilant and call us if you see something odd.

0870-S-260917 A white escort van W789 DJN was seen in suspicious circumstances in Hatfield. If you see this vehicle, please call us on 101.

A white Van with two Asian males was seen loitering in and around Bromyard. The vehicle VRM is similar to L504WLY, but this comes back as no trace on our systems, so either there is a digit wrong or the plate has been altered in some way. If you see this vehicle please call us on 101 as we would like to catch up with the driver for a quick chat.
