On the subject of 2018 and support, West Mercia Police are orchestrating some changes to how our SNT newsletters are written and delivered across the County. The introduction of James, our police volunteer, means that we (officers), are able to pass some of our administrative jobs over to him which will free us from some office bound clerical work. To make things slightly easier for James, he will be compiling one newsletter for the whole of Herefordshire County, with sections devoted to the individual policing teams. The finer details have yet to be finalised, but to receive ANY newsletter, you will need to sign up to the Community Messaging service on the www.westmercia.police.uk site. West Mercia are also planning to have Bromyard Neighbourhood Watch Coordinators/ administrators on Facebook who will work alongside the current Herefordshire Neighbourhood Watch (NHW) coordinators that are already running our Facebook pages. This will ensure that news/ incidents from all across the county are reported on the site and there will be local knowledge available to answer any related queries. I know some people are not huge fans of social media, but it is a really quick and efficient way to get information out into the public domain. If you are already on Facebook (or face Cloth as my uncle calls it!), it really is worth having a look at the Herefordshire NHW site.



CANCELLED Sunday 10th December 2017

I was due to hold a tool marking event at Bromyard Police station tomorrow, but due to the expected snow showers and freezing temperatures, I will postpone this event until Sunday 14th January 2018. I will post new location/times etc nearer the date.

Pcso Berrett will be in attendance at Bromyard Post Office for you to go along and discuss any issues or local policing concerns with her. There is also a separate room if the matter you wish to discuss is private.

Incidents of note

There have been two separate incidents of sheep worrying across our patch which is a bit of a concern considering there was also a recorded incident last month too.

A reminder to all dog owners, YOU have the responsibility of making sure your dogs are on leads when near livestock, even if they have never chased a sheep before or don't seem concerned about them, animals are not always predictable. If your land/garden backs on to land where livestock graze, then you as a responsible dog owner need to ensure that your boundary lines are all secure so the dog can't get out.

0456-S-211112 and 0160S-S-261117. Two separate incidents of vans being targeted for tool thefts. A resident in Norton challenged two males when he interrupted them stealing tools from his van, he saw them leave in a dark green Nissan with a partial VRM of VK06. This incident was between 1500-1600 in the AFTERNOON! Please be vigilant and if you have any information regarding this vehicle, please get in touch via 101. The second vehicle targeted was parked in Whitbourne, but offenders were unable to gain access in this instance.

0100-S-221117 and 0201-S-171117 Two vehicles, one parked in Lodon Avenue and one parked in Teme Close, have both had the lights on the top of the vehicles removed by offenders. Nothing seen or heard, but please be extra vigilant if you have any extra signage/lighting on your vehicle.

Suspicious incident

0897-S-22117 A suspicious male has been seen in the area of Felton, no other description than he was wearing all dark clothing and possible trying to gain access to an outbuilding. Please be extra vigilant in this area and call us with any unusual sightings on 101.

0413-S-031217 A male was seen in the area of Docklow taking pictures of nearby properties. When challenged by a property owner the male stated he was a police officer and left soon after. If you are in any doubt about the identification of a police officer or police staff, ask to see their warrant card and ask for their collar number. If you are still concerned ring 101 and ask the police call taker to confirm who the person is. Always check identification of anyone turning up on your door step.

The West Mercia drink/drug campaign has been off to a flying start with 6 people arrested across the county in the very first December weekend. One woman arrested near Bromyard blew 117 on the roadside breath test, with the legal limit being 35. An excellent result for officers to take these added dangers off our roads, especially considering the ice and snow we are currently experiencing.
