REGISTER OF PARISH COUNCILLORS' INTERESTS

Section 30 of the Localism Act 2011 provides that a member or co-opted member of a relevant authority, such as a Parish Council, must notify any disclosable pecuniary interests to the authority's monitoring officer - in Bodenham's case the Monitoring Officer of Herefordshire Council. This part of the new standards regime came into force on 1 July 2012.

Disclosable Pecuniary Interests are defined in the Schedule to The Relevant Authorities (Disclosable Pecuniary Interests) Regulations 2012 as being pecuniary interests covering:

- employment, office, trade, profession or vocation;
- sponsorship;
- contracts with the relevant authority;
- land;
- licences to occupy land;
- corporate tenancies;
- beneficial interests in securities.

In addition to their own interests, members are required to declare the interests of their spouse or civil partner, of any person with whom they are living as husband and wife, or of any person with whom they are living as if they were civil partners.

Each member's declaration of interests is available for public inspection and those for the members of Bodenham Parish Council are recorded in Herefordshire Council's Register of Members' Disclosable Interests.
